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### **Welcome / Territory Acknowledgment**

As we gather virtually this evening, we would like to honor the existence of the First Peoples by acknowledging that we are on the traditional land of the Anishinaabe, Haudenosaunee, and Mississauga peoples. New Dundee Public School occupies the land of the Between the Lakes Treaty from 1792. As learners, we continue to understand this place has significance to the First Peoples because of the rolling hills, forests, flat land, and the proximity to the Nith and Grand River, which is fed by the Great Lakes. Settlers need to take responsibility to continue our education and honor of the First Peoples. Let's work to honor the Dish with One Spoon covenant, a peace agreement made between the Indigenous nations before the settlers arrived. It characterizes our collective responsibility to each other and to Mother Earth. We should only take what we need and leave enough for future generations.

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## **Principal Update**

### Updates

- Mr. Kongdara worked hard over the summer by himself to make sure school was clean for staff and students to return
- Great first week of school – Welcome Back Assembly on Friday September 5 – introduced/reviewed RISE character traits – Code of Conduct
- DVFs sent home second week of school – please return if you have not already
- Forms on School Day – Media Release, Concussion Protocol, Responsible Use of Technology – if not yet signed please do this ASAP
- Meet the Teacher September 11th – excellent turn-out
- Completed two of three fire drills per Health and Safety – one more tomorrow
- Lockdown Drill scheduled for next week
- Working with small committee on SLIP (school learning and improvement plan) – looking to ensure 80% or more of our students in Grade 3 & 6 achieve provincial standard or above on EQAO – Acadience (early literacy screening tool, SK-2, phonological awareness, decode text), ORF (oral reading fluency assessment tool, literacy screening 4-6, student reading fluency), MAAP (math achievement action program, developed by the ministry, exposing all students to grade level expectations) – also focus on Equity Habits of Mind
- This will also benefit the other grades – full staff engagement
- Also focus on RISE – code of conduct – Respect, Integrity, Safety, Encouragement – celebrated in the form of Gotchas
- Asbestos - there still some in the school and is in the top of the building and not easily disturbed. It will be removed eventually, but board is prioritizing schools that have the hazard in a more easily disturbed area
